In welcoming all of the esteemed members of Leadership 100 to your 31st Annual Conference, I would like to thank you for the honor of choosing as your theme “Celebrating the 100th Anniversary of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America” and initiating the program for the celebration itself. It sets the tone for a new era of creative cooperation among all the institutions and supporters of our beloved Church in America.

Dr. Alexander Kitroeff To Address History of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America at Thursday Forum

Dr. Alexander Kitroeff, Professor of History at Haverford College in Haverford, PA, will address the history of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America, at the Thursday Forum, February 10, 2022. Kitroeff was born in Athens, Greece in 1955 and completed high school and university studies in the United Kingdom. After doing national service in Greece, he moved to the United States in 1986 to pursue an academic career. He has taught at the Byzantine and Modern Greek Studies Center at Queens College, the Hellenic Studies Program at Princeton University, the History Department at Temple University, as well as the History Department and Onassis Center for Hellenic Studies at New York University. He began teaching at Haverford College in 1996.

He holds a B.A. from University of Warwick (1974), an M.A. from University of Keele (1979), and a D.Phil. from Oxford University (1984). His research and publishing focus on nationalism and ethnicity in modern Greece and its diaspora, and its manifestations across a broad spectrum, from politics to sports.

His books include: *The Greeks in Egypt, 1919-1937: Ethnicity & Class* London: Ithaca, 1989; *Griegos en América* Madrid: MAPFRE, 1992; *Wrestling with the Ancients: Modern Greek Identity and the Olympics* New York: Greekworks, 2004; *Ελλάς, Ευρώπη Παναθηναϊκός! 100 Χρονία Ελληνική Ιστορία* New York: Greekworks, 2010; *The Greeks and the Making of Modern Egypt* Cairo: American University in Cairo Press, 2019; and *The Greek Orthodox Church in America: a Modern History* Northern Illinois & Cornell University Press, 2020.

Dr. Kitroeff collaborates with film director Maria Iliou as the principal historical consultant in four documentaries: *The Journey: the Greek Dream in America* (2007); *Smyrna 1922: the Destruction of a Cosmopolitan City* (2012); *From Both Sides of the Aegean: Expulsions & Population Exchange, Turkey-Greece 1922-1924* (2013); and *Αγαπημένη Θεία Λένα: το Έργο και η Ζωή της Αντιγόνης Μεταξά* (2017). Their current project is a 5-part history of the city of Athens, from 1821 to the present. Part 1, "Athens Between East & West, 1821-1896" premiered in February 2020 at the Benaki Museum in Athens.

George D. Yancopoulos and Christos Kyratsous To Address Friday Forum

George D. Yancopoulos, MD, PhD, and Christos Kyratsous, PhD, will address the Friday Forum, February 11, 2022, on their pioneering research to combat Covid-19. Yancopoulos is the Co-Founder of Regeneron and has been President and Chief Scientific Officer of the company for the past 30 years. He is the holder of more than 100 patents. He is a principal inventor and developer of Regeneron's nine FDA-approved medicines and foundational technologies for target and drug development. He has spearheaded Regeneron's program to address the Covid-19 pandemic with an investigational antibody cocktail.

The son of Greek immigrants, he graduated as valedictorian of both Columbia College and the Bronx High School of Science. He received his MD and PhD degrees in 1987 from Columbia University's College of

Physicians & Surgeons and became a professor of biology at age 28.

Christos Kyratsous, Vice President of Research, Infectious Diseases and Viral Vector Technologies at Regeneron, heads its infectious diseases research team, and leads one of the most advanced efforts to design a drug that can treat and prevent Covid-19. He received his B.Sc. in Pharmaceutical Sciences from Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, and a Ph.D. in Microbiology from Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons.

A native of Greece, he and his team previously developed a therapy for Ebola patients—a drug that proved so effective in reducing mortality in clinical trials that the study came to an early close.

Dr. Lisa Liberatore and Dr. Dimitri Kessarlis To Address Saturday Forum

Dr. Lisa Liberatore, a board-certified Otolaryngologist and her husband Dr. Dimitri Kessarlis, a board-certified Urologist, who were inspired by their autistic son, Michael, 24, to found two nonprofit organizations, Luv Michael, in 2015, and US Autism Homes, in 2019, will address the Saturday Forum, along with their Program Director, Mark Biondi, on February 12, 2022.

Dr. Liberatore stepped away from her successful private practice after 25 years to focus on a crisis affecting her son and thousands of others on the autism spectrum. The statistics for adults on the autism spectrum are alarming, with a 90% underemployment and unemployment rate and an over 400% higher suicide rate.

Her passion to help her son and others in the same situation has led to the impressive early success of both nonprofit programs, providing a life of dignity and purpose for autistic adults beyond the lives of their parents.

Based in NY, these two 501c3's focus on creating meaningful work and alternative shared living opportunities. The goal is creating a sustainable model to be able to offer this opportunity to all who need it and to replicate it across the country.

Luv Michael is a nonprofit granola bakery in Tribeca, NYC focused on training, educating, and employing autistic adults.

In 2020, it launched a volunteer community service program, to advocate for autism acceptance while helping fundraise for the organization. Volunteers now consist of more than 14,000 teenagers from 29 countries who have engaged in meaningful conversations with over 300,000 people.

The second nonprofit, US Autism Homes (USAH) focuses on helping to solve the current housing crisis impacting autistic individuals and their families. The USAH model is to combine a cluster of homes with a faith-based supportive community. Currently, USAH operates three homes in Southampton, NY and has successfully transitioned individuals into an engaging shared living experience. USAH's first faith-based community partner, The Dormition of the Virgin Mary Greek Orthodox Church in Southampton, NY, provides a place for daily classes and programs, as well as a network of community members who are fueled by helping and serving those in need.

Bishop Andonios to Present Plans for St. Michael's Home

His Grace Bishop Andonios of Phasiane will speak on the plans for a new St. Michael's Home facility on Thursday, February 10, 2022. His Grace was elected on December 11, 2001, by the Holy and Sacred Synod of the Ecumenical Patriarchate of Constantinople as an Auxiliary Bishop of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America. He was given the title of Bishop of Phasiane, an ancient Diocese in Pontos, the birthplace of his grandparents. He received an MDiv with Distinction from Holy Cross School of Theology in 1979. He served for four and a half years as Deacon to Archbishop Iakovos until December 3, 1989, when he was ordained to the Holy Priesthood.

Following his ordination, he continued to serve in both the Office of the Archbishop and the Office of the Chancellery and was Assistant Chancellor and Personnel Director of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of North and South America. He served the parish of Zoodohos Peghe in the Bronx from 1992 to 1995.

In 1996, he was appointed Director of St. Michael's Home in Yonkers, NY. In June 2000, Archbishop Demetrios appointed him to the new position of Director of the Archdiocesan Department of Philanthropy.

Archbishop Demetrios of America, in consultation with the Holy Eparchial Synod, appointed His Grace to be the Chancellor of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America, effective October 1, 2009.

He retired in 2019, promising to devote himself to the completion of St. Michael's Home, an adult care facility and assisted living/retirement home for the aging Greek American community.

A Resolution of Thanks and Appreciation by the Archdiocesan Council on May 10, 2019, expressed "its deepest gratitude and most sincere appreciation to His Grace Bishop Andonios of Phasiane for his broad and most dedicated service to the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese."

Rev. Protopresbyter Andreas Vithoulkas, Chancellor of the Archdiocese, To Speak on Role As Presiding Priest and Archiepiscopal Vicar of the St. Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church and National Shrine at the World Trade Center

The Reverend Protopresbyter Andreas Vithoulkas, Chancellor of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America will speak on his newly appointed position as the Proïstamenos (presiding priest) and Archiepiscopal Vicar of the St. Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church and National Shrine at the World Trade Center. He will address the Friday breakfast, February 11, 2022.

Father Andreas graduated in 1994 from Hellenic College (with distinction) with a BA in Religious Studies. In 1998, he graduated from Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology, receiving an M.Div. (with high distinction). He was ordained to the Diaconate and Priesthood in 2007 and was immediately appointed

Assistant to the Chancellor of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America, Bishop Savas of Troas, now Metropolitan of Pittsburgh.

In 2014 he was awarded the rank of Economos and in 2017 that of Protopresbyter. Between the years 2007 and 2019, he served as Assistant Priest and Presiding Priest in three parishes, the Cathedral of St. Paul, Hempstead, NY, Holy Trinity Church, Bridgeport, CT, and Church of the Holy Resurrection, Brookville, NY. In 2020, he was appointed Presiding Priest of St. George Greek Orthodox Church in Manhattan, NY.

In 2019, Archbishop Elpidophoros of America appointed him Chancellor of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America and he continues to serve in that position to this day.

On August 25, 2021, His Eminence Archbishop Elpidophoros of America formally announced his appointment to be the Proïstamenos and Archiepiscopal Vicar of the St. Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church and National Shrine at the World Trade Center.

On November 2, 2021, His All Holiness Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew awarded him the rank of Protopresbyter of the Ecumenical Throne during the Special Service of Blessing and Opening of the Doors at the Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church and National Shrine at the World Trade Center.

Theo Nicolakis, Chief Information Officer, to Speak on Modernizing Archdiocesan Technology and Digital Transformation at Opening Forum

Theo Nicolakis, Chief Information Officer for the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America, will speak on Modernizing Archdiocesan Technology

and Digital Transformation at the Opening Forum on Thursday, February 10, 2022.

Nicolakis spearheads the technology leadership for the Archdiocese. He created the award-winning goarch.org website; designed the Online Chapel; enabled the first live Internet webcasts of Greek Orthodox Church services in the USA; was responsible for the creation of the Daily Readings mobile app and the GOARCH TV app for AppleTV, Roku, and Amazon Fire.

Nicolakis has been tapped to oversee the digital communications and technology operations for six international events for Ecumenical Patriarch

Bartholomew including the 2014 meeting with Pope Francis in Jerusalem, and served as CIO of the Great and Holy Council in Crete in 2016. Nicolakis has advanced the engagement of Orthodox Christians with the Scriptures. He was responsible for development of the Children's Bible Reader for Orthodox Youth, the Orthodox Christian Bible for the Archdiocesan Camping Programs, and the first ever Orthodox Christian Military Bible for our service men and women. Nicolakis currently serves on the Board of Directors for the American Bible Society and served as President of St. Barbara Greek Orthodox Church in Orange, CT.

He received the MDiv degree from Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology in 1996 and an MA in Management Systems from New York University in 2005.

Rev. Fr. Gary Kyriacou, Director of Ionian Village, to Speak on Plans for Transformation of the Facility at Opening Forum

Rev. Father Gary Kyriacou, who serves the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America as the Director of Ionian Village, the Archdiocese travel abroad summer program, will speak on plans for the transformation of the facility at the Opening Forum on Thursday, February 10, 2022.

Fr. Gary also serves as the Pastor of Youth and Young Adult Ministries for the Greek Orthodox Metropolis of San Francisco. He received his Master of Divinity degree from Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology in 2001, following which he was ordained to the Diaconate on May 27, 2001, and to the Holy Priesthood on September 9, 2001. Prior to his studies at Holy Cross, he received his Bachelor of Arts degree in Film Production and Screenwriting from California State University – Northridge.

Following ordination, Fr. Gary was assigned as the Assistant Priest to Rev. Fr. Tom Paris, of blessed memory, at the Ascension Greek Orthodox Cathedral in Oakland, California from 2001 – 2004. In August 2004, he was assigned to Saint Demetrios Greek Orthodox Church in Camarillo, California, where he served as the Proistamenos for 17 years, until February 2021. During his service he guided the parish through a successful capital campaign to build new facilities that serve the growing community. Saint Demetrios celebrated the Thyranoxia on May 31, 2015, and the new building was permanently occupied in July 2015.

In November 2019 His Eminence Archbishop Elpidophoros of America appointed Fr. Gary the Director of Ionian Village. In February 2021, His Eminence Metropolitan Gerasimos expanded the Office of Youth and Young Adult Ministries and designated him as the Pastor of Youth and Young Adult Ministries for the Metropolis of San Francisco. Fr. Gary also serves as the Chairman of the Board of Trustees for the Greek Orthodox Metropolis of San Francisco Folk Dance and Choral Festival. He has devoted countless hours leading this ministry where he excels at gathering the youth of the Metropolis and sharing with them the importance of the Greek Orthodox faith and culture.
